

Kaaterskill Creek Watershed Conservation Initiative

The Greene Land Trust is very excited to report that we are working with local landowners and project partners, such as Scenic Hudson to protect the resource significant Kaaterskill Creek Watershed. An area consisting of nearly 3,000 acres has been identified as a priority area for conservation. As shown on the following map, the area is bounded by Route 23A on the north, Mossy Hill and Charles

Smith Road on the west, Ulster County line on the south and the NYS Thruway on the east.

The Kaaterskill Creek Watershed area was identified as an area of conservation priority for its multiple resources that align with the Greene Land Trust's conservation priorities:

- protecting watersheds and water quality, •
- protecting biodiversity,
- contributing to climate resilience,
- supporting productive forestry or farming and
- protecting scenic places.

The area includes large, forested tracts on ridge tops with scenic value and steep forested hillsides down to the creek and wetlands important to climate resilience. It also contains prime farmland and grassland, most of it within the flood zone. The area is also a rich biodiverse wildlife corridor.

The Kaaterskill Creek Watershed priority area was assessed using the 2019 Natural Resources Inventory (NRI) for Greene County. The NRI compiles and describes important natural resources in Greene County. The information is presented in a series of maps that allows the visualization of resources where they occur and how they relate to each other, their surroundings, and existing development. The Greene Land Trust has made substantial progress on this initiative and hopes to close on two easements in this area in 2023. In addition, discussions have been initiated with the owner of a third property in the area. We are very enthusiastic about this initiative and look forward to reporting future exciting developments.

Exploring the Hudson River at low tide reveals all sorts of magical plants and animals. Down by the river at Brandow Point, the wild rice is in full bloom. When these photos were taken the other day, the wild rice was gently swaying in the breeze. Bald eagles noisily squabbled in the nearby tall oak trees, and great blue herons patiently waded among the pickerelweed, softstemmed bulrush and arrowroot to find fish. The wild rice -- an important food source for both native people and migrating waterfowl -- is a symbol of the millennialong human relationship with this wild estuary. And Greene Land Trust is working hard to protect it!
